Lawful absence/tardiness is defined as an excused absence for any portion of the day under the following conditions only (COMAR 13A.08.01.03):

1. Death in the immediate family
2. Illness of the student
3. Court summons
4. Hazardous weather conditions
5. Work approved or sponsored by the school
6. Observance of a religious holiday

7. State emergency
8. Suspension
9. Lack of authorized transportation
10. Other emergency or set of circumstances which, in the judgment of the Superintendent or designee, constitutes a good and sufficient cause for absence from school.

The school must receive a note from the parent or physician explaining the absence/tardiness of a student within two school days of the student's return or the absence/tardiness will be unlawful/unexcused. When a doctor's certification for chronic illness has been required and not provided within two school days of the student's return, the absence/tardiness will be recorded as unlawful/unexcused until a doctor's certificate is provided.

Absences and/or tardiness for reasons other than those described above are unlawful and will be unexcused. Any requests for absences of a non-emergency nature must be requested in writing to the principal, who in consultation with the Administrative Director, will determine if the absences are lawful (excused) or unlawful (unexcused).

Developing regular, prompt attendance patterns helps prepare your child for future success in life. Parents can help develop these important skills in many ways:

- \*Have a regular bedtime that allows your child enough time to be rested
- \*Have your child do something relaxing, like reading a book, 30 minutes before bedtime.
- \*Have a regular wake-up time and a consistent morning routine
- \*Pack backpacks with books and homework the night before so there is no rushing in the morning.

**Attendance Policy Reminder**

Please be advised that each student is allowed 3 Local Discretionary days each school year that can be used for personal reasons (vacations, reunions, etc). Any days over and beyond the 3 LD days may be coded as Unlawful/Unexcused depending on the reason for the absence. Teachers are not required to give students missed work for Unlawful/Unexcused absences.

Furthermore, any student requesting an absence of 15 days or more (not including the 3 LD days) for Unlawful/Unexcused reasons will be withdrawn and parents will be required to re-enroll the student upon return. Greetings,

Our new Healthy Activity Program with Virgin HealthMiles has been a tremendous success thus far. As a result of the enthusiasm for this innovative program, we have received inquiries about how now Non-HCPSS employees (substitutes, temporary employees, family members, school-based police officers, parents in the community, etc.) can join and participate in the Virgin HealthMiles program. While only HCPSS employees (current employees who are eligible for health insurance through the HCPSS) are eligible to enroll in the *HCPSS* Virgin HealthMiles program, Virgin HealthMiles offers an individual program to the public for a fee. The program cost includes a \$29.99 joining fee (includes pedometer and first month's membership) and then \$2.75 each month thereafter, payable by credit card.

Non-employees may join Virgin HealthMiles by going to [www.virginhealthmiles.com/getactive](http://www.virginhealthmiles.com/getactive). Once enrolled, new members will receive a pedometer and be able to track their activity in the same way HCPSS members do. They will have their own personal LifeZone (the website - which would not be

associated with HCPSS). Because this is an individual program, the members would not qualify for rewards through HCPSS (monetary, gift cards, iPads, etc.), nor would they be able to participate in HCPSS corporate-wide challenges. Members would have a personalized and customized LifeZone where they can take a Health Snapshot, track all of their activity and calories, use the workout planner, challenge other Virgin HealthMiles members(including HCPSS members), and enter measurements. It would be a very similar program to the one that HCPSS employees enjoy; however, there would not be any rewards.
